## From The Water & Sewer Department

My water bill has gone up and it says that I have high usage! What do I do?

First of all, find your meter and read the numbers on it. Compare that to the reading stated on your bill. Two weeks or so has passed since the meter was read so it's easy to determine if you are on pace for another high usage. There is a red or black triangle on the face of the meter. As water is being used this triangle will spin. Make sure all the water is

off and check to see if it's spinning. Maybe even take a picture of it and wait a half hour or so and see if it has moved at all.

99.9% of high usage is a result of a leaky toilet. Often times you cannot hear or see the water moving. Try putting a few drops of food coloring or koolaid in the tank, wait a few minutes and see if any of the color has made its way into the bowl. The flapper is most likely the bad guy here. Do not use chlorine tabs as a cleaning/disinfection agent that lay in the bottom of the tank. This high concentration of chlorine will distort the flat surface of the flapper not allowing it to seat properly robbing you of water and hard earned dollars! Also, sometimes it can be a stuck float. It could need a cleaning or maybe a slight adjustment.

Garden hoses are also a source of water loss. Most generally out of sight and out of mind while you are in search of your lost water!

Leaky water faucets. Yes, that constant drip besides being annoying it is wasting water and is steering you to a high water bill. Do you know how many drips are in a gallon of water? Most times these drips can be fixed relatively quick and inexpensively. There are many tutorials on youtube to help you complete the repair so there is no reason to let it continue to drip. Multiply this by the other sink faucets, tub, clothes washer, shower head..etc. It adds up quickly.

Another source of leaks is a pin hole in the supply line or in a soldier joint or other fitting. A pinhole the size of a pencil lead (1/16") can add up to over a 25,000 gallon loss in just 1 month!!

The average gallons of water per day a person uses in your normal routine is 80-100. So it doesn't take long for a drip or stuck toilet float to take you over the minimum allotment of gallons and a possible high water bill. The answer to the question of how many drips of water in a gallon is 15,140!
